

Test of paragraph wrapping

Normally we wrap paragraphs by looking for spaces between the words. However, with long technical command references and URLs, sometimes this gives ugly results. We attempt to split really long words on certain tokens: slashes, dots etc.

This is an attempt to break long URLs sanely. Here is a file name:
C:\Windows\System32\Drivers\etc\hosts.

This paragraph has a URL (basically, a word) too long to fit on one line, so it just overflows. http://some-really-long-site.somewhere-verbose.com/webthingies/framework/xc4987236hgsdlkafh/foo?format=dingbats&content=rubbish. Ideally, we would wrap it in the middle.
